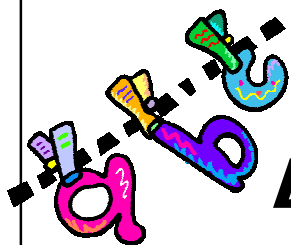

Developing Early Writing - ALAN PEAT

WEDNESDAY 17 MARCH 2010

Purpose of Workshop:

Participants will be given a wealth of practical **new** ideas which can be used in the busy classroom to enhance pupils' understanding of the writing process. A particular feature of the day will be how to link early reading and writing experiences more closely. Participants will learn how to develop better the pupils' sense of story and non-fiction forms.

MORNING SESSION (9:30-12:15)

Developing a 'story' sense

Using Alan's 'story-in' boxes game participants learn how to 'make' stories with pupils so that they physically sequence all the elements of narrative. Joint book making activities which relate to this will also be explored.

Writing for a range of purposes (writing with children!)

Listing opportunities, early instructional writing; shifting the 'accent' from mark making to meaning. Links will be made to a range of the stepping stones and the Key Stage 1 NLS objectives.

AFTERNOON SESSION (1:00-3:30)

Analysing pupils' writing to inform future progress at Foundation Stage and Key Stage 1

The session uses examples of early writing and considers practical strategies for assisting writers from the pre-phonemic stage through to a KS1 Writing SAT Analysis tool developed by the presenter.

Making early writing fun!

If we want to raise standards we need to make the process of writing fun! The presenter will consider early collaborative writing games, ways the teacher can model the writing process and methods of increasing the impact of writing in a structured 'play' context.

Intended Learning Outcomes:

The day will draw on Alan's articles and books so that participants will gain ideas and insights about how to 'move' from oral storytelling to early scaffolded narrative writing.

Presenter Profile:

ALAN PEAT

Alan is the author of many publications on a wide range of subjects. His literacy books have been best-sellers for both Nash Pollock and Questions Publishing (now Imaginative Minds). He also publishes his own books through Creative Educational Press Ltd. Alan writes for the Times Educational Supplement, Teaching Thinking magazine and a wide range of other journals. His practical ideas have now been used in 22 countries. Previously Alan has been an LEA Adviser with cross-phase responsibility for Literacy and Gifted and Talented Provision. He was Head of the Museum and Gallery Education Service as well as a Teaching and Learning Consultant for Blackburn LEA. Alan now runs the international independent education consultancy company 'Alan Peat Ltd' which specialises in creativity, literacy development, thinking skills, middle management training and gifted and talented provision. A Fellow of the Royal Society of Arts, Alan is also a member of the National Association of Writers in Education (NAWE).

Early Understanding and Misconceptions of Key Mathematical Number Concepts/Practical Models and Images

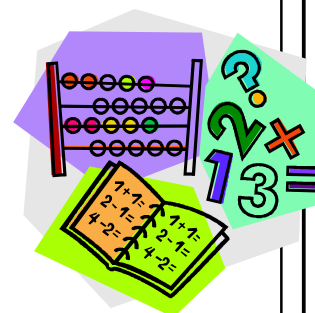
- Early activity – memory game

- ‘Models and images’ – the NNS charts and DVC
- Making connections – what’s in a number?
- Developing an understanding of early place value
- Place value models – place value charters, arrow cards and Deines apparatus, place value video

AFTERNOON SESSION (1:00-3:30)

Further Development of Models and Images/ICT Images and Activities

- General models and images for KS1 addition and subtraction – bead string, coat hanger, washing lines, number lines, counting stick, flip flops, counting jar (linked to mathematical imaginings)
- Alternative images – **Numicon** and Stern representations, equaliser/scales, abaci, dominoes, alternative 100 squares
- A progression grid for KS1 calculation
- Using arrays for multiplication and division
- ICT images in KS2
- Free CD of resources, activities and proformas!



Intended Learning Outcomes: Participants will:

- ✓ have a clear understanding of the main mathematical concepts which children find difficult in KS1
- ✓ be able to demonstrate the key number concepts to children by effective use of a range of models and images
- ✓ understand the value of an environment for number within the KS1 classroom

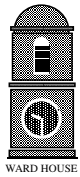
